
History of Landcare in Australia

Started in Victoria 30 years ago by a group of farmers wanting to work together to do something about land degradation in their region.

Grew and evolved across all states and territories of Australia through a diverse movement of volunteers working across public and private lands.

Groups today include Coastcare, Bushcare, Friends, Young Landcare, Indigenous Landcare and Intrepid Landcare groups, led by local communities working together to look after important natural areas.

Landcare Australia raises funds to provide grants to landcare groups across Australia and hosts the annual national Landcare conference and awards.




What is Landcare?
