ENERGY SUPPLY: TJINTU SOLAR FIELD


• 1.8MW system, installed 2016;

reduce reliance on fossil fuels;

 Produces 15% to 30% daily electricity requirements;

• 5 separate sites, different areas,

negate "cloud effect";



WATER CONSUMPTION REDUCTION PROJECT 2018

 Power & Water responsible for all groundwater extraction, treatment & supply;

 In partnership with Power & Water have instigated project to reduce water consumption;

Chasing reductions of over 50%;

 Additional water saving devices in guest accommodation and hotel gardens



CHALLENGES

- Number of guests in small area and associated ground and sand dune stability from that amount of foot traffic;
- What do you mean I can't camp wherever I would like to?;
 - off road campers..... anywhere;
 - risk of fires from uncontained campfires, especially in spinifex;
 - disturbance to specific areas, including threatened species monitoring sites;
 - flattening of spinifex, shrubs, cutting down of Desert oaks, protected species etc.
 - tying their washing line to No Camping signs......
- Remote location, all the challenges that brings;
- Staff turnover, knowledge of area, environmental outcomes, traininger etc.

THE FUTURE?

- Rolling out ISO 14,001 Environment management system 2018 2019, standardising, documenting items discussed;
- Diesel at \$2.20/L, what happens as it increases in price, what is the tipping point for towing caravans, is \$3/L, \$4/L?
- Had our first guest Tesla, in October 2018, 3 phase power.
- 5 new electric vehicles (Hyundai, Nissan, Jaguar, Telsa) to be launched on Australian market next year. Can drive from Adelaide to Darwin in an electric car;
- Increasing urbanisation, citification of world, attraction of the remote;
- Appears to becoming a near pilgrimage experience for many Australians
