





Carbon Burning




- The CLC has helped traditional owners to set up the region's first Aboriginal carbon abatement business
- Comparing carbon output in wildfires, to carbon outputs in cool controlled fires and creating carbon credits
- Allowing extra access to country for rangers and TOs
- Funding more fire management work and country visits.
