
WHY HAVE AN NRM PLAN?

- Guide and prioritise investments and activities in NRM in the NT
- Identify new opportunities and **partnerships**
- Monitor and evaluate progress at a broad scale
- Show collective impact of NRM investment in the NT
- Facilitate partners to **negotiate** conflicting priorities
- NRM community setting priorities rather than outsiders

STEPS for DEVELOPING NRM PLAN





1. Conceptualize

- Define initial team
- Define scope, vision, targets
- Identify critical threats
- Complete situation analysis

5. Capture and Share Learning

- Document learning
- Share learning
- Create learning environment

2. Plan Actions and Monitoring

- Develop goals, strategies, assumptions, and objectives
- Develop monitoring plan
- Develop operational plan

4. Analyze, Use, Adapt

- Prepare data for analysis
- Analyze results
- Adapt strategic plan

3. Implement Actions and Monitoring

- Develop work plan and timeline
- Develop and refine budget
- Implement plans

WHAT IS COLLECTIVE IMPACT?

Collective impact occurs when a group of actors from different sectors commit to a common agenda for solving complex social or environmental problems.






WHEN THINGS AREN'T WORKING

5 ELEMENTS OF COLLECTIVE IMPACT

1	Common Agenda	 Common understanding of the problem Shared vision for change
2	Shared Measurement	 Collecting data and measuring results Focus on performance management Shared accountability
3	Mutually Reinforcing Activities	 Differentiated approaches Coordination through joint plan of action
4	Continuous Communication	 Consistent and open communication Focus on building trust
5	Backbone Support	 Separate organization(s) with staff Resources and skills to convene and coordinate participating organizations
	Territory Natural Resource Management	

ONGOING REVIEW & ADAPTIVE MANAGEMENT
